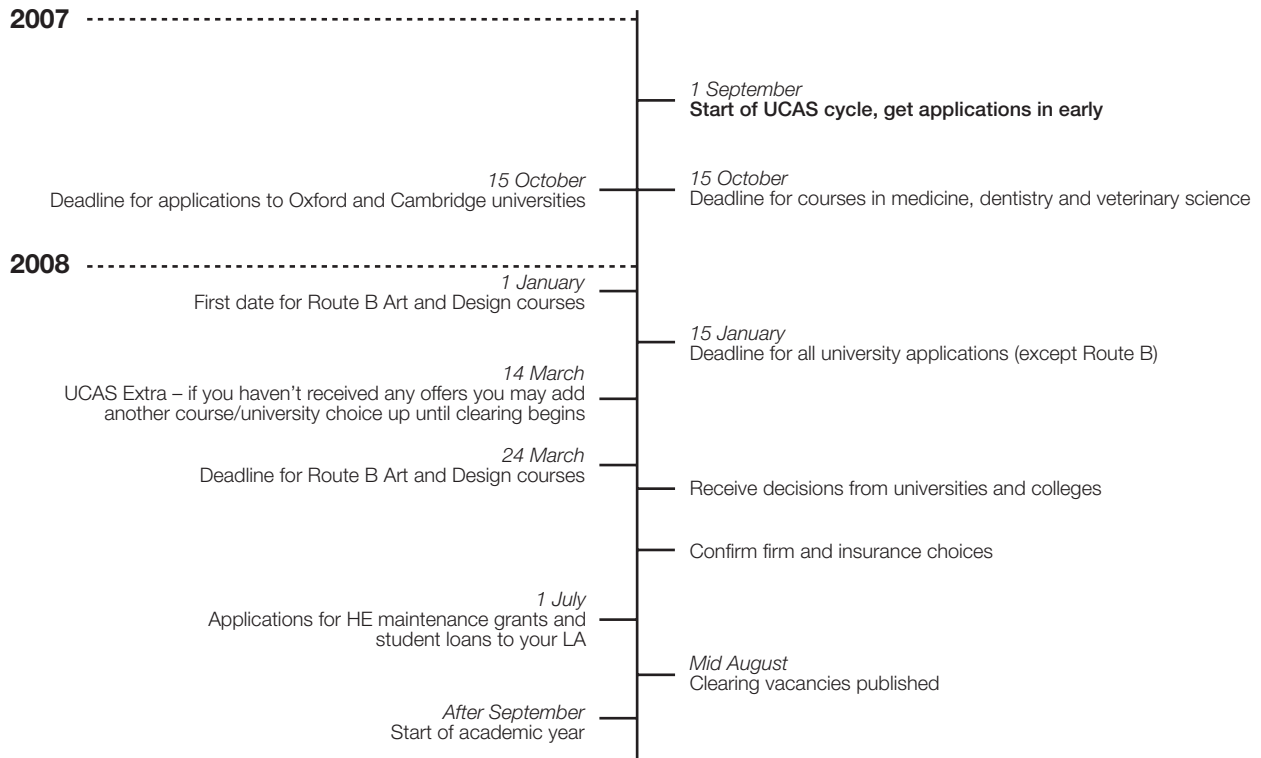


6. Applying to university

Applications to full-time higher education courses in the UK must be made through UCAS. For further information visit www.ucas.com. For some nursing and midwifery courses you need to apply through NMAS. Visit www.nmas.ac.uk.

How do I apply to university?

You can apply to university using an online application system – www.ucas.com/apply. Your school or college can give you a 'buzzword' that allows you to login to the website.

Your school or college will also have their own deadlines to ensure they have time to check your application and write your references.

Are there any restrictions on choice?

- You can make up to **five** choices when applying to UCAS (2008 entry).
- Although students usually choose the same or similar courses at five different universities, you can apply for more than one course at a university.
- If applying to Oxbridge you must choose either Oxford or Cambridge; you cannot apply to both.
- If you apply to medicine, dentistry or veterinary science, you can only make four choices in one of these subjects and one further choice in a different subject.

How can I check my application?

Once you have applied to UCAS you will be sent details of how to check the progress of your application using the online applicant enquiry service.
